## CLASS HEADINGS CONVERGENCE PROJECT

This glossary explains what the **Words** used within the Project *mean*:

Acceptable term	<i>A term that is acceptable for classification purposes, i.e. a term that will be acceptable in a list of goods and services.</i>
Child	<i>Items in the hierarchy that have other items above them (i.e. parents) when talking about relationships. Can be both group titles and terms.</i>
Class heading	<i>A collection of Nice terms that indicate in a general manner the fields to which the goods and services in principle belong</i>
Class scope	<i>Acceptable group titles that together cover all goods or services in the harmonised database in a given class at a given time</i>
Database term	<i>A term that is acceptable for the database of goods and services (a.k.a. the Harmonized Database) and in accordance with the Rules of the Database as agreed upon during Harmonization Workshops.</i>
General terms	<i>A general term is a broad term, which generally will be placed high up in the hierarchy, while terms that are more precise generally will appear in lower groups of the hierarchy.</i>
Group	<i>A collection of terms and other groups that share the same characteristics. A Group can be either or both a parent and/or child).</i>
Group title	<i>The title given to a group of items that describes all items within the group. Should if possible be an acceptable term.</i>
Harmonized Database	<i>The Database which contain the terms that have been agreed to always be acceptable classification terms by the participating offices.</i>
Nice Class heading	<i>See Class heading</i>
Parent	<i>Items in the hierarchy that have other items below them (i.e. children) when talking about relationships. All group titles are parents in relation to the contents of that group.</i>
Project objective	<i>The aim of the Working Group ("Find common understanding about the scope of a particular class and compile a list of classification terms that ideally cover all goods or services in a class, as far as we understand at that particular point in time + decide how this practice can be communicated and implemented" )</i>
Working group	<i>All Offices and Organisations that are part of this Convergence Project.</i>

Work package	<p><i>Tasks that contribute to the achievement of the Objective.</i></p> <p><i>There are 4 Work Packages in this Project:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><i>1: Developing a Common class practice</i></li> <li><i>2: Communication strategy</i></li> <li><i>3: Implementation strategy</i></li> <li><i>4: Analyse possible implications for the past (dependent on the outcomes from 1)</i></li> </ol>
Work package group	<i>A Sub-group of the Working Group assigned to a Work Package</i>
Specific terms	<i>A general term is a broad term, which generally will be placed high up in the hierarchy, while specific terms are more precise and generally will appear in lower groups of the hierarchy.</i>
Sub group	<i>A group that is a child of a (parent) group</i>
Sub-Group title	<i>The title of a group that is a child of a (parent) group</i>

Term	<i>Terms are the words or combination of words that are acceptable terms of goods or services in the harmonized database.</i>
